


## Tom Collins' *The Claret Murders*Receives High Marks from 21<sup>st</sup> Annual *Writer's Digest Self-Published Book Awards*

Judges Praise Author's Effective Use of Historic 2010 Nashville Flood to Enhance Suspense; Mystery

Nashville, TN - - (TBD) Some of America's most recognizable literary minds are taking notice of *The Claret Murders* and are making room for its author, Tom Collins, to join their elite ranks. The prestigious *Writer's Digest Self-Published Book Awards* just delivered *The Claret Murders* a score of four out of a possible five.

"That's phenomenal!" Collins says of the judge's evaluation of his latest book. "Five is considered outstanding, so a four out of a maximum of five isn't bad."

"The author cleverly deals with puzzles and the solving



thereof on multiple levels, not only the murders, but also a secret identity, and even more so, an hold house with a dubious history and secret rooms," the judges wrote in their critique. "All these layers make the novel more entertaining."

Writer's Digest grades every book in the competition on **structure** and **organization**, **grammar**, **production quality** and **cover design**, **plot**, and **character development**. A score of one means the book needs improvement. A score of five means judges found the book to be an outstanding read.

*The Claret Murders* is believed to be the first work of fiction to incorporate Nashville's historic 2010 flood into its storyline. But Collins' employs his masterful style of storytelling to ensure *The Claret Murders* appeals to people far beyond Nashville's city limits. "Even though the novel is set in Nashville, the author cleverly avoids country music cliches and focus on a natural event and its impact on a community and on individual lives," the judges wrote.

"All of my books feature Nashville as a backdrop," Collins explains. "But this story is different because the city's historic flood of 2010 plays a central role in the story. It becomes an adversary that even main character Mark Rollins' money and powerful friends are no match for."

*The Claret Murders* – the fourth installment in a series of books – tells of yet another unforgettable Mark Rollins adventure. In *The Claret Murders*, Rollins becomes entangled in the life of attractive, young attorney Ann Sims, who has "gotten herself in over her head." Collins effectively weaves the essentials of a great mystery – greed, lust, and crime – into what some critics are calling a "Tom Collins with a twist."
